#### Logline:

In a high-stakes competition for the rights to Billy Joel's catalog, a stage-frightened pianist, a violinist drowning in alcohol, and a cellist torn between veterinary school and music must master the art of classical performance and original songwriting—before time, talent, or doubt pull them apart.

### Synopsis:

When Jason Strenski, a shy barback with stage fright and a photographic ear, discovers a once in a lifetime competition for the rights to Billy Joel's catalog, he recruits two unlikely allies. Aaron, a charismatic but pressure-ridden violinist, and Lucy, a gifted cellist torn between vet school and music. As the trio trains in classical performance and original songwriting, they must overcome sabotage, self-doubt, and fractured ambitions to prove their worth—not just to the judges, but to themselves. Set against the backdrop of New York's underground music scene, *She's Got a Way* is a coming of age drama about legacy, friendship, and the fight to earn your place in music history.

Thematic Focus:

- Young friendship, unspoken love
- Music and memory
- The price of obsession

### Characters:

JASON STRENSKI (Main - Pianist)

- 20's, barback/busser, self taught musician with hyperthymesia.
- Represents both self doubt and obsession.
- Deeply tied into his mother's love for music.
- Secretly enters the competition while hiding his true talent.

### LUCY (Supporting - Cellist)

- 20's, an undergraduate science student, cellist, close friend.
- Represents friendship and love.
- Lost the desire to play music after a childhood of forceful training.

AARON (Supporting - Violinist)

- 20's, Korean, a music student, alcoholic, and comic relief.
- Represents **passion and ego**.

- Overly dedicated to his craft. Uses alcohol as a release from reality.

HENRY (Supporting)

- 70's, African American, a jazz club owner, band member, and mentor.
- Jason's personal music instructor and father figure.

ALEXA RAY JOEL (Supporting)

- Plays herself, poised and guarded, a rival competitor, and masterful performer.
- Represents the **weight and complexity of legacy**.

SOFIA (Supporting)

- Proctor of the Billy Joel competition and judge.
- Represents the pressure of perfection and gatekeepers of the music world.
- Mysterious background, but deep understanding of everything music.

Why the story works without Billy? (But is stronger with him):

1. A classical framework.

The rewritten script uses more classical music to explore the discipline and mastery behind the scenes.

2. From fictional to impossible.

The story can stand on its own: an underdog, two friends, and a mysterious music contest. But the story soars when Billy is involved—because it's not just about a **fictional dream**, but about chasing a **real, impossible one**. If a fictional singer-songwriter was used, the story would highlight their success and following. With Billy, there's no need.

3. Anchored by his own journey.

Themes of self doubt, love, alcohol, creative burnout, and public expectations. These themes can be rich with any artist, real or fictional, but especially with Billy.
